DRINKING WATER ADVISORY FOR THE TOWN OF ARNPRIOR – AFFECTING SULLIVAN INDUSTRIAL PARK

October 19, 2017 – 6:00 AM

The Town of Arnprior has issued a **DRINKING WATER ADVISORY** until further notice for ALL BUSINESSES IN THE SULLIVAN INDUSTRIAL PARK, excluding Pillar5. This order does not apply to any other areas within the Town of Arnprior.

This order affects the following streets:

Decosta Street, Hartney Street, McCartney Street, Didak Drive, and properties serviced by Arnprior on Herrick Drive

PLEASE DO NOT CONSUME OR BATHE IN TOWN SUPPLIED WATER. This is not a boil water advisory as **BOILING WATER OR CHLORINATING IS NOT SUFFICIENT.**

The advisory is being issued due to a loss of pressure in the water distribution system throughout the Sullivan Industrial Park. At approximately 9:30 PM on October 18th, an unexpected loss of pressure occurred in this area.

Following the receipt of these reports, the Town notified the Renfrew County and District Health Unit (RCDHU) as well as the Ministry of Environment that a loss of pressure in the Town's distribution system occurred. The RCDHU has issued a **DRINKING WATER ADVISORY.**

This advisory is issued as a precaution and will be rescinded once the Town and Renfrew County and District Health Unit can confirm that water in the distribution system is safe to drink. The Town is currently coordinating water sampling and quality testing in order to make this determination. This drinking water advisory will not be lifted until at least 6:00 am on Saturday October 21, 2017; however, it could be extended if required.
